Principles of NVV Grantmaking	Guidelines for Grantee Selection
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All major investments are intended to address a documented, demonstrated community need</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Grant recipients must have adequate infrastructure and staffing to implement effectively</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All major investments are intended to have a measureable impact on the community</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>When possible, fund organizations that use <i>promising practices or evidence based models</i></li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Invest deeply, rather than broadly</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Majority of grant funds support programs for Napa County's neediest residents, with the balance going to programs that benefit the average resident</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Focus support on strategies that are <i>upstream</i> (i.e., focused on prevention)</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>NVV has two <b>long-term strategic priority areas</b>: Community Health and Children's Education</li> </ul>
